Welcome back to what we hope is the best year yet for Alder Grove Charter School! Make sure to read your online or printed newsletter each month for an up to date list of events and activities!

We are continuing to use Let's Go Learn, an online assessment to pinpoint strengths and weaknesses for students and to identify students who need extra academic support. If your student qualifies for Academic Support, you will receive a letter in early September and you will need to fill out a plan with your CT. Your CT will let you know when to bring in your student to take the online assessment.

Enclosed in this newsletter is our schedule of optional onsite classes along with class descriptions. Please make sure that you read the descriptions and enroll your students in appropriate classes. If you have any questions, ask your CT. Enrollment begins August 10.

This year we are planning Friday workshops on most Fridays from 10:00am to 12:00noon. #### **ATTENTION:**

As many of you know California has recently changed the way that schools are funded using the new Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). Schools now receive funding based on the number of students enrolled who fall into certain income brackets. Schools with more low income students will receive more money than schools with a higher percentage of low income students. For this reason, we are required to get current income amounts verified by parents each year. Please take a minute to complete the enclosed form stating your estimated income for the year 2015. Providing this documentation will allow us to maximize the funding that we receive and allow us to continue with the amazing opportunities we are able to provide to our students. If your student lives in two households, you can use the income of either one on this from. Please don't hesitate to contact the school if you have any questions.

#### **Special Information For Parents in Case of Emergency**

#### Telephones/Communications:

In the event of an earthquake, flood or other natural disaster, keep your radios tuned to your local radio station (KHUM, 104.7 or 104.3 for advisory information). Please do not call the school as we must have the lines open for emergency calls.

#### Dismissal:

Should there be a major earthquake, children will remain under the supervision of school authorities until parents or responsible adults can pick them up.

#### Student Release Procedure:

- 1. Go directly to the entrance of the school or evacuation area. In case of fire, students will be in paved parking lot on F Street side of building.
- 2. Inform teacher, aide or adult responsible for that classroom that you are taking the child.
- 3. Proceed with child back to Student Release Table to complete a Student Release for each child you are taking. Do not remove your child or any other child from school without signing the emergency release form and showing your picture ID to the school staff. This provides us a record of where each child is when someone else arrives later looking for the child.
- 4. Unless you are staying to volunteer, please leave as quickly as possible after signing out your child.
- 5. Adults will be needed to help with first aid, dismissing students, helping with classes, monitoring traffic, etc. If you are able to volunteer to help, talk to the director or teacher in charge about what you can do to help. Volunteers should leave children with their classes and not sign a student release form until they are ready to leave.

#### If You Can't Get to the School:

Should a major disaster occur, it is likely that many parents will not be able to reach the school right away. If conditions make it necessary, we will release your child to the adult indicated on your child's Emergency Release form. We will keep a written record of the child and the adult to whom the child has been released.

The school director or teacher in charge will determine the need to leave the building. In the event the building cannot be reoccupied or if a fire requires evacuation of the school, the students will be transferred to the nearest available safe shelter.

#### Food and Water:

In the event that children would need to remain on campus for several hours after any sort of a disaster, there will be a supply of fresh water and limited food, in the school emergency kit.
