We had about 90 students attend over two Saturdays to practice taking the CAASPP test, eat pizza, and win prizes. We're excited to see how test scores will be affected as these events continually increase familiarity with the test interface and style of questions asked. More Interimpalooza events will happen early in the 2018-2019 school year.

Speaking of testing, CAASPP (Smarter Balanced) testing is coming up soon! **State mandated assessments begin April 23rd, and on-campus classes will be cancelled April 23rd to the 27th.** (Classes will resume on the 30th.) Please contact your CT to schedule a time to have ALL 3rd-8th, and 11th grade students assessed. CAST (science) testing will include 5th, 8th, many 11th, and all 12th grade students. Ask your CT if you have any questions. Thank you for bringing your students to CAASPP testing so we can gauge how best to meet the educational needs of AGCS students and comply with state mandates. A big thank you to Stefani and Brett, our testing and technology coordinators, for organizing this huge task!

Watch for Governance Council ballots in a separate mailing. Please cast your vote for our next Governance Council members ASAP. Thank you to Stephanie, Kellie, Vicki, Wendy, and Delcie for your service and dedication to AGCS this year! We really appreciate those AGCS parents who volunteer their time in Governance Council to make decisions for the school. It was an interesting and challenging year, but wise decisions were made while always considering what is best for our students and our school. We couldn't do it without you...

Also included in that separate mailing will be a parent survey about our CTs. It's very helpful for CTs to receive feedback from families about what they are doing well and what needs improvement. Thank you for filling these out and returning them to the school.




Spelling Bee Winners!

Additionally, some students went on to participate in the Humboldt County Science Fair and two Alder Grove students received recognitions:


Jaydon Wickizer earned a Science Excellence Award, and Meguire Bartosz won first place for 6th grade!!

Testing Schedule: Mark Your Calendars!!

Hello, Students and Families,

April is here and with that comes state mandated testing. As you know, California takes testing seriously, so we must test *all of our eligible students. Please mark your calendars with the following dates:*

April 23-April 27: CAASPP (Smarter Balanced) testing will take place from April 23-April 27. Students in 3rd through 8th grades, along with 11th graders, will be tested in Mathematics and Language Arts. **Your CT will let you know when you can sign up for morning and/or afternoon testing slots during that week. Your CT can discuss with you the length of time necessary for each student to complete all sections of the test.** *There will be NO ON-CAMPUS CLASSES during this testing week.*

April 30 and May 2: In addition, the California Science Test (CAST) field testing will take place April 30 and May 2. All students in 5th, 8th, **and 12th grades** should schedule a morning or afternoon time slot on one of these days. **Selected 11th graders will also be asked to take the CAST.** This is a computer-based assessment, and should take approximately 1-2 hours.

On-campus classes will resume this week.

The California Physical Fitness Test (PFT) is also coming up for 5th, 7th, and 9th grade students. The test involves 6 quick-strength and flexibility activities, including a timed one-mile walk/run. Contact your CT to get a form or to ask any questions you might have about completing the PFT. Forms, along with links to instructional videos, are also available on the Alder Grove website.

These forms will be due NO LATER than May 17th.


