# ALDER GROVE STUDENT HONORED BY FORTUNA POLICE

Joseph Bishop, a sixteen-year-old from Humboldt County, did not hesitate when he witnessed two twin-boys drowning in a hotel pool last summer.

On vacation in Columbia, Maryland, Joseph and his father Michael, a thirty-six-year employee of the Postal Service, chose to visit the hotel swimming pool early in the day. A family with six young children were also approaching the pool area when their two six-year-old twin boys ran ahead. The first boy ran straight into the pool. Joseph recognized the child was in trouble right away and could see that his parents were not close enough to save him.



Without hesitation, Joseph jumped into the pool. "...The first thing I noticed was he didn't come back up, his arms just started wailing. [My] ...first ...instinct [was] to jump in, grab my arm under him and pull him out," Joseph said.

Michael, who had followed his son into the pool to help, thought that they may need to perform CPR on the young boy. Fortunately, after Joseph located the boy and pulled him to the surface, he began coughing up the water. No sooner had Joseph saved the one young lad, before his twin brother had jumped in the pool also, mere seconds later. Already in the water, Joseph was able to rescue the brother as well.

Michael and Joseph said the whole incident happened very quickly. The twins' tearful parents were overcome with gratitude that Joseph was able to aid their boys before they were able to catch up with the speedy youths.

"Everybody that knows Joseph knows that when you make friends with Joseph, you're a friend for life," Michael praised his son. A Campton Heights native, Joseph, is currently a sophomore at Alder Grove Charter School in Eureka. His teacher Patty Marsh, found out about the Bishops' summer excitement and wanted to let the community know what a brave thing Joseph had done.

Joseph's mother, Pamela, attributes his swimming lessons for saving the twins' lives last fall, saying that Joseph began taking them as a toddler. She would love to see a community pool in Fortuna in the future. "It's really been hitting home to me how much we need a pool here," Pamela said. "I've thought many times since this happened how difficult it was to get swim lessons for our kids."

When Joseph and his sister McKenzie were very young, Pamela would drive the children south to Myers Flat for youth swimming lessons, and later north to Arcata. "They were little, and it was an effort to get them there – taking two toddlers," she explained. "I'm thankful that we did that and I'm sure the parents of these kids are too."

Although driving long distances with small children was difficult for Pamela, she said, "I'm so thankful that we made that commitment, for these guys it turned out to be a life or death matter."

The Fortuna Police Department presented Joseph with a commendation at City Hall on March 21st. Michael said that the recognition from the community means a lot to the entire family, "We're so proud of him and excited." After hearing of Joseph's heroic act, Michael told us that a couple of the Fortuna Police Officers, told him, "Isn't that just like Fortuna to go 3000 miles away and be able to save a child?"

For Joseph, doing the right thing is its own reward. "It felt really good," he said. His family and community could not be prouder of his quick thinking and bravery.

## Teen honored for saving two boys' lives in pool

Fortuna native Joseph Bishop is a hero and has received special recognition for his actions in August 2021, when he saved two young boys from drowning in a swimming pool.

Bishop and his family had traveled to the East Coast for vacation.

Bishop received the Citizens Real Hero Award from the City of Fortuna and the Fortuna Police Department, and a proclamation from the Fortuna City Council at the Council's March 22nd meeting.

"It is the police and judicially recognize Joseph for his heroic actions which saved two boys from drowning," Fortuna Police Chief Casey Day said.

"The fact that he was attentive to what was going on and present in the moment speaks significantly about his young man's character," Day added.

He described Bishop's actions as a demonstration of selflessness and in no doubt, an act of heroism.

"Without concern for his safety, he jumped into the pool and brought both boys to the surface, where they were assisted by others," Day said.

Reading the city of Fortuna proclamation recognizing Bishop, Fortuna Mayor Sue Long said, "Joseph Bishop's instantaneous courage and decisive action allowed him to save two young boys from drowning by pulling them out, and bringing them out of the pool and commending." His actions are to be admired and commended.

Both members of the Fortuna City Council shook Bishop's hand and extended individual and personal appreciation.

"This means the world to me, absolutely. Thank you very much," Bishop said.

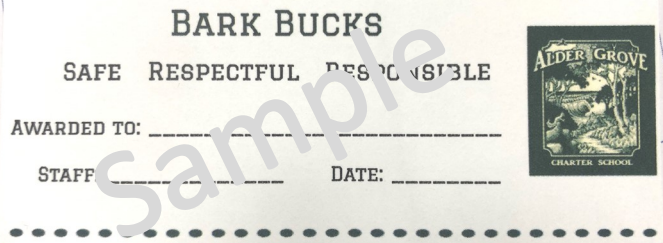

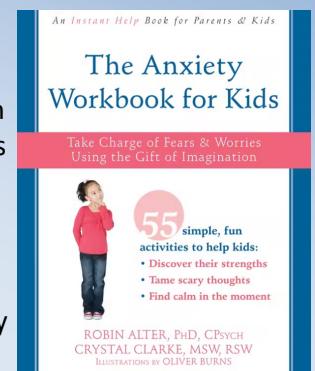

PBIS has a proven record for [improving school climate at schools across the country](#). Still, introducing PBIS to a school can produce a fair share of resistance. Educators may fear that PBIS will leave them with no effective means of behavior management. Administrators may be reluctant to upend the traditional system of discipline. You may even get some pushback from the students themselves because PBIS may be different from their known experience with school interactions. There are plenty of PBIS myths out there that keep schools from implementing PBIS. We're here to tell you not to let those faux barriers get in your way. We will take a look at the top PBIS myths over the upcoming months.

### Myth #1: PBIS rewards students for what they are supposed to be doing.

The fact is, many students aren't coming to school with the foundational skills they need in order to be successful. Numerous reasons for this exist, including disadvantaged backgrounds, cultural differences, and developmental issues. For many, school is where they develop appropriate social and emotional skills. PBIS helps to establish behaviors that students will carry with them throughout their lives.

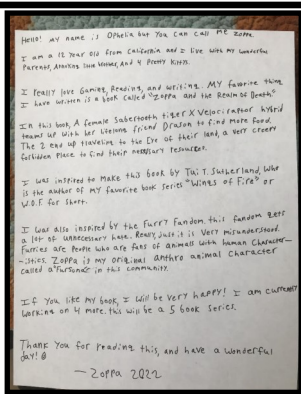

## SOCIAL JUSTICE STUDENTS RECEIVE VISIT FROM LOCAL AUTHOR

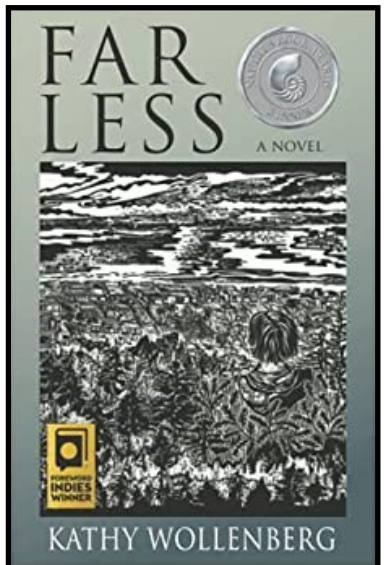
