If students HAVEN'T taken a CR class before (concurrent or dual) they MUST complete a <u>CR Applica-</u> tion, as well. Pro Tip: Make sure they have or know their SSN before starting the application.



Students taking DUAL ENROLL-

MENT or CR WORK EXPERIENCE do not register via WEBADVI-SOR. They register via ALDER GROVE on campus registration and will complete ADD CARDS the first week of class with the onsite course instructor.
