## PROM IS CANCELLED THIS YEAR!





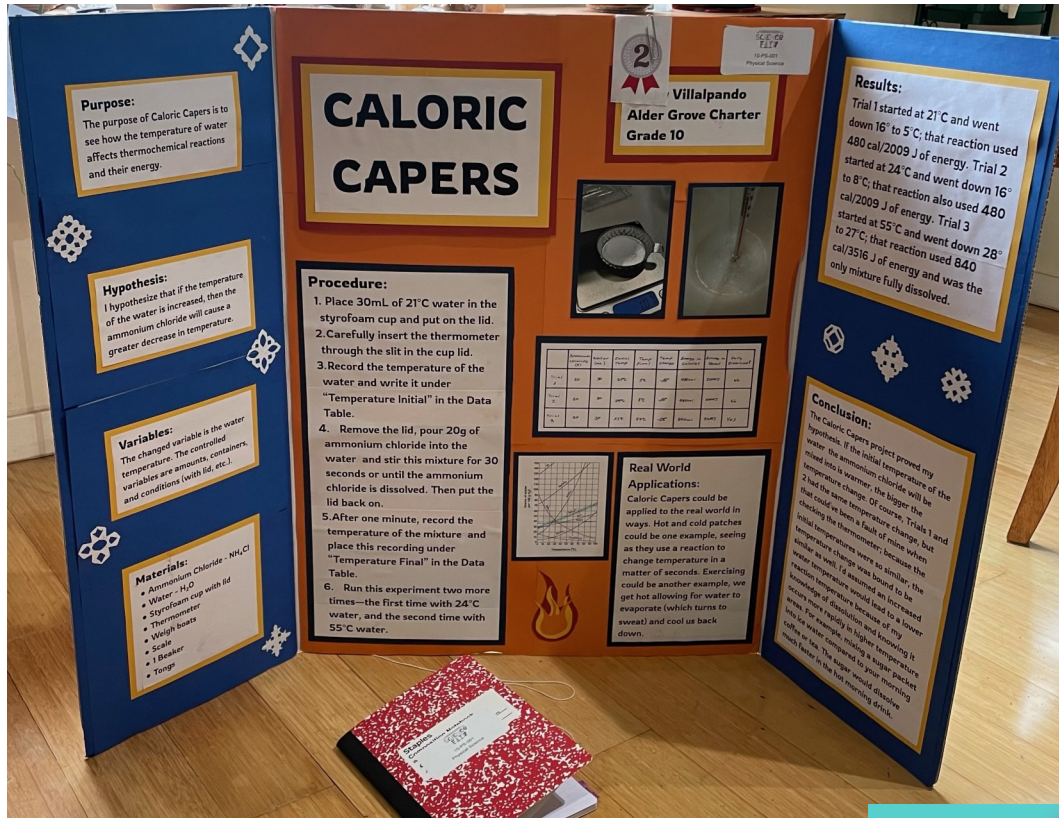

In March, two Alder Grove students participated in the Humboldt County Science Fair!



10th grade student Rocky Villalpando entered her project "Caloric Capers", which focused on the energy released during some chemical reactions.

This was entered into the competitive division, and Rocky won 2nd place with her project!

4th grader Aaron Campos shared a poster called "Race Time," which detailed his findings from an investigation on kinetic energy.




## RACE TIME

**Purpose:** To investigate the effect of track height on a car's distance traveled.

**Hypothesis:** If the height of the ramp is increased, then the car will go faster and further.



**Description of straight track:** Made of 25 hot wheels tracks with no curves or bends

Type of car	Height: 31 in	Height: 37 in
#72	28	35
Black with red top	22	26.6
Red car	20.5	26
Black car	19	25.5
Transparent	26	31.5




**Description of loop track:** Our looped track was made from a total of 28 pieces of track. There were 5 before the loop, 3 in the loop, and 20 after the loop.

Type of car	Height: 31 in	Height: 37 in
#72	22.5	23.5
Black with red top	17	20
Red car	2	4
Black car	20	20.5
Transparent	3.5	7



**Summary/Conclusion:** On the straight track, when we increased the height of the track, all the cars went further.

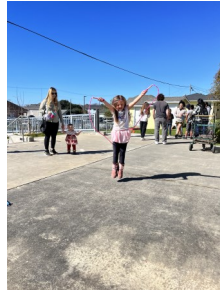




## FIELD DAY 2024

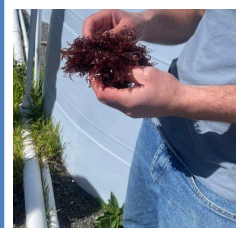

# TESTING SCHEDULE: MARK YOUR CALENDARS!

I cannot believe it, especially with this weather, but Spring is just around the corner, and with that comes state mandated testing, i.e. CAASPP and the PFT. If you haven't read Tim's notes about the high stakes of testing all eligible students, laws impacting charter renewal have made it more critical than ever to test all of our eligible students.

**I am not exaggerating when I say that the future of our school depends on our students' participation in state testing!**

**PLEASE MARK YOUR CALENDARS WITH THE FOLLOWING DATES:**

**April 1 - April 12:** Week One of CAASPP testing will take place from April 1 - April 5. Students in 3rd through 8th grades, along with 11th graders, will be tested in Mathematics and Language Arts. All students in 5th, 8th, and some 11th and 12th graders will also take the California Science (CAST). Your CT will be contacting you about scheduling these sessions soon! **Week One of testing coincides with on-campus classes and labs.**

**April 8 - April 12:** Week Two of CAASPP testing will take place from April 8 - April 12. **There will be NO ON-CAMPUS CLASSES during Week Two of testing.**
